IACP: Flood scenario

Scenario	The large-scale mudflow/flooding in late spring, in Zarafshon Valley affecting roughly 150,000 people.
Targeted population	55,000 people (37% out of total people in need)
Estimated funding requirement	\$10,960,126
Participating Sectors	CCCM, early recovery, education, food security and nutrition, health, shelter and non-food items, WASH (protection mainstreamed)
Objectives	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Building the basis for a joint inter-sector REACT response plan (Flash Appeal) to meet the needs of the most vulnerable people affected from 1 to 6 weeks of onset of floods/mudflow2. Defining considerations for a detailed relief and recovery response interventions.
Endorsement	On – line endorsement by REACT members, April 2018
Update	2021, main updates are related to operational arrangements

IACP Earthquake: Summary

Scenario	A 7,2 magnitude (MMI) earthquake with epicentre near Khorog city of GBAO, affecting around 95,000 people (incl 20,000 displaced)
Humanitarian consequences	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Displacement of population in rural and urban areas;- Damaged infrastructure, limited access;- Extreme rise of need in healthcare;- Interruption in water and electricity supply;- Increased food insecurity; and etc.
Planning horizon	1 – 6 weeks
Targeted population	58,500 people (30% of total affected population)
Strategic Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Save lives and alleviate suffering by providing and/or ensuring access to multisectoral assistance to those most affected.• Protect the rights of those most affected, and promote inclusive access to humanitarian assistance, with particular attention to the most disadvantaged groups.• Support the recovery and resilience of the most affected by protecting, restoring and promoting their livelihoods and well-being.
Total budget	6,767,772 USD (excluding Shelter and NFI)

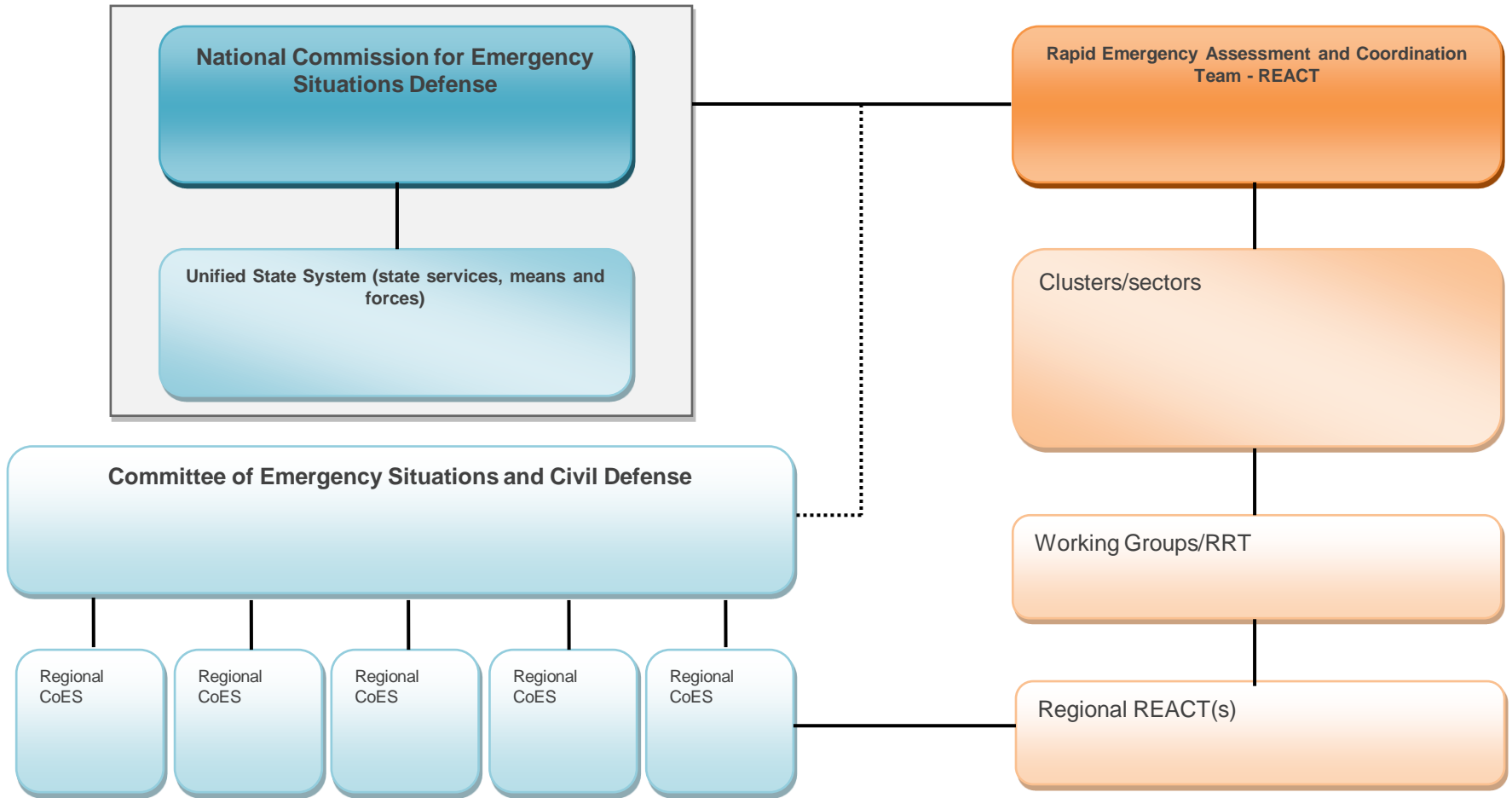
- Safe and accessible emergency water and sanitation services

IACP Earthquake: Preparedness Actions

- Ensure capacity building sessions (at least twice a year) on humanitarian principles, architecture for national and international partners;
 - Regular operations of the Rapid Response Team and Analysis and Information Management WG, trained on application of TIANA tools;
 - Establish Emergency Coordination Group and capacita on emergency communication tools;
 - Establish Community Engagement Working Group and capacitate it on Accountability to Affected Populations (AAP), Protection against Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) and Communications with Communities (CwC);
 - Identify appropriate approach for Humanitarian Cash Transfer programming;
 - Agree on the status of UN Emergency Reserve for Tajikistan in lieu of UN reform (UNRC and UNDP de-lining process);
 - Test IACP through a table-top Simulation Exercise.
