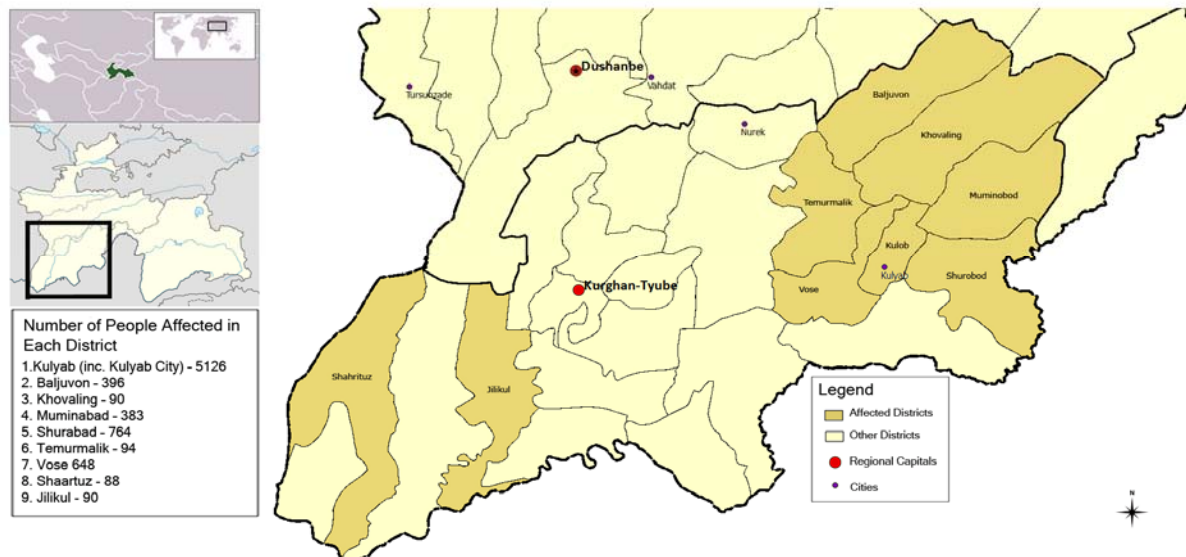
Executive Summary / Highlights

- The government has completed the food distribution for the flood affected families in four of the resettlement plots in Kulyab city this week.
- Construction of the 593 houses in Kulyab city and 79 houses in the surrounding districts is ongoing. In Kulyab city the task is 54% complete and in the surrounding districts 39% complete.
- The government is organizing a mobilization campaign to clear the Tebolay channel beginning on the 25th of July 2010.
- No increase in the rates of communicable diseases were reported this week.

Kulyab City

- According to information reported by CoES Kulyab, about 30% of the flood affected people waiting for houses are actually living at the plots. The rest are either living back at their old houses in the flooded area or with relatives.

Surrounding Districts

- Out of 79 families only eight are provided with tents for temporary shelter, the rest 90% of the families are currently living at their relatives.

Humanitarian Response

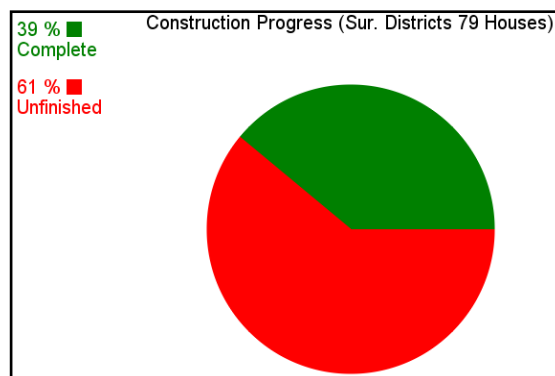
Kulyab City

- The construction of the planned 593 houses for the flood affected families is ongoing at the six new resettlement plots allocated by the government. The total construction project is 54% complete based on the figures provided by CoES. The installation of the power line is ongoing and the installation of the water system (pipes) for the area has begun this week.
- Construction Progress (Kulyab City - 593 Houses)

- Construction has also begun on the new school, hospital and service center that is intended for future use by the residents of the new settlement.
 - No new non-food item distributions are currently planned.
 - The government has completed the food distribution for the flood affected families in four of the plots in Kulyab city this week. Food for the distribution has been provided from the government's warehouse. Each family received a two month supply of flour, oil, rice and sugar. Distribution to the last plot (plot five) and an additional distribution of potatoes and onions will be completed next week. (Note: The houses to be built on plot six have not yet been allocated to families)
 - Iran's Imam Khomeini Relief Committee (IKRC) recently completed a distribution of foodstuffs and detergent to 600 families in Kulyab city.
 - The "First Aid" points established jointly by state health service and RCST at every resettlement plot report no increase in rates of communicable diseases in the resettlement area this week.
 - The government is also conducting a mobilization campaign to clean the Tebolay channel. All trucks and heavy equipment available will be used in a ten day campaign to clean the channel beginning on the 25th of July. The stones cleared from the channel will be used as gravel to cover the new streets of the resettlement area in Kulyab city.

Surrounding Districts**(Baljuvon, Khovaling, Muminabad, Shurabad, Temurmalik, Vose and Kulyab District)**

- 79 new houses are currently under construction in the surrounding districts based on the figures provided by CoES. The entire construction project is currently 39% complete.
- No new non-food item distributions or food distributions took place this week.
- Oxfam has begun the construction of permanent latrines in Dahana Jamoat of Kulyab district and in Vose District. A total of 240 latrines will be built in Kulyab and Vose Districts when the project is finished.
- No increase in the rates of communicable diseases has been reported in the disaster-affected districts this week.
