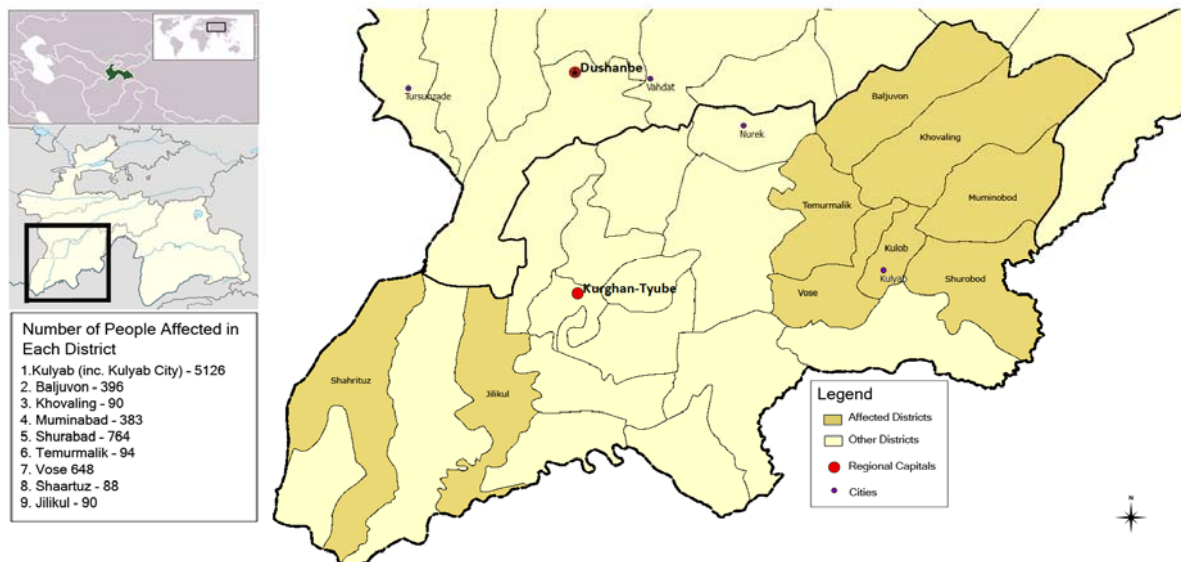
Executive Summary

- RCST has identified a need for the provision of warm clothing to the flood affected families before the cold weather comes.
- An additional 7.5 tons of flour is required to finish the food distribution to families from the fifth land plot.
- CoES approved the distribution of an additional 71 houses this week to flood affected families whose applications were previously pending.
- Save the Children has completed the second round of their food distribution to the surrounding districts this week.

Updated 28 June 2010



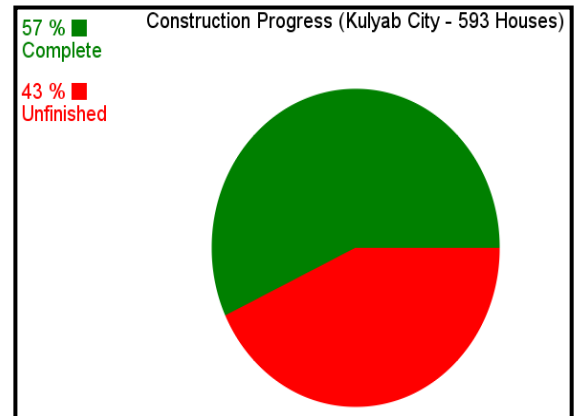
The Red Crescent Society of Tajikistan (RCST) has identified the need to provide affected families with warm clothing before the winter comes.

An additional 7.5 tons of flour is required to finish the food distribution for families from the fifth land plot. A request has been made to the central government to provide more flour.

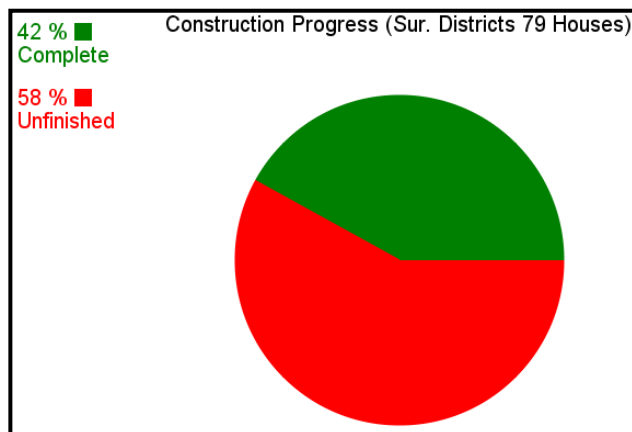
Humanitarian Response**Kulyab City**

- The construction of the planned 593 houses for the flood affected families is ongoing at the five new resettlement plots allocated by the government. The total construction project is 57% complete based on the figures provided by CoES.
- CoES approved the distribution of an additional 71 houses this week to flood affected families whose applications were previously pending. 579 of the 593 houses to be built on the five land plots have now been allocated to flood affected families.
- No new non-food item distributions are currently planned.
- More flour is needed before the government can complete the food distribution to the last plot (plot five). The distribution of bread each morning has also stopped due to lack of flour. A response to the request made to the central government to provide more flour is still pending.
- No increase in the rates of communicable diseases have been reported by the first aid point in the resettlement area this week.
- The mobilization campaign to clean the Tebolay channel will begin on the 25th of July and last for ten days. Plans for trucks, bulldozers, leveling machines and fuel have been put into place this week. The stones cleared from the channel will be used as gravel to cover the new streets of the resettlement area in Kulayb city.
- The Red Crescent Society of Tajikistan (RCST) completed their monitoring assessment at the resettlement site this week. The results of the monitoring will be compiled and available for review next week.



Surrounding Districts**(Baljuvon, Khovaling, Muminabad, Shurabad, Temurmalik, Vose and Kulyab District)**

- 79 new houses are currently under construction in the surrounding districts based on the figures provided by CoES. The entire construction project is currently 42% complete.
- Save the Children has completed the second round of their food distribution to the surrounding districts this week. A total of 240 tons of wheat, 120 tons of lentils, 35 tons and 272 kgs of oil have been distributed to 4800 flood affected beneficiaries upon the completion of the scheduled distributions.
- No new non-food item distributions took place this week.
- No increase in the rates of communicable diseases has been reported in the disaster-affected districts this week.
