

### Floods in Kulob City and Surrounding Districts, Khatlon Province GLIDE Number: <u>FL-2010-000087-TJK</u> Situation Report № 7 - <u>18 May 2010</u>

#### Situation Overview

Work continues on improving conditions on the three camps in Kulob and attention is increasingly being given to conditions in rural areas. A REACT appeal for further assistance is underway. The launch of the appeal is planned for 19 May 2010, 15:00 at Hyatt Regency Hotel. All the costs related to the launch are covered by Hotel as contribution to emergency response. A REACT planning meeting will be held on 18 May in Kulob to review plans for the resettlement of flood-affected populations from the camps to the new site.

### **Damage and Needs Information**

### Humanitarian Response

Relief and Recovery Operations (outside Kulob City)

A total of 10 tents from the Red Cross Society of Tajikistan and the Committee of Emergency Situations are being sent to Muminobod and Shurobod Districts.

# Flood-Displace in Kulob City

WASH:

The Red Cross Society of Tajikistan has provided 30,000 chlorine tables.

# Education and Protection:

A kindergarten run in collaboration by the Kulob Education Department and Save the Children for 200 children was opened on May 15, 2010. In total 115 children from Camp 1 attended the first day of the kindergarten. Arrangements to attend kindergarten are being made for children from Camp 2 and 3.



The Head of the Commission established for this emergency, Mr. Alimardon, requested the Department of Education to allocate additional space for kindergartens, emphasizing the importance for appropriate childcare especially during the time of resettlement of the families to the new site.

Save the Children has indicated that they are ready to support additional kindergarten. REACT Secretariat for Kulyab is coordinating provision of additional food rations for the next 3 months with relevant partners in collaboration with the Commission.

The Disabilities Support Center in Kulob has identified a total of 23 disabled children in the Kulob tent camps and is looking for support to assist these individual.

Food Security: No new information.

### Health:

According to media reports, one child (aged 1.3 years) died during the night of 17-18 May 2010 in the tent camp. The cause of this death is being assessed.

The medical unit at the Kulob stadium camps reports a need for medications to deal with diarrhea.

According Dr. Davlatov Said, Head of the Sanitary and Epidemiology Administration, Ministry of Health anti-dysentery bacteriophage has been distributed in all camps. There is an urgent need for anti-typhoid bacteriophage for preventive purposes.

The Red Crescent Society of Tajikistan will distribute Bensyl Benzoate, provided by the Aga Khan Health Services, in a topical solution for use against parasites.

Sanitary information bulletins on key public health prevention messages are needed for distribution to the affected population. The Commission will provide first aid kits to each tent.

Oxfam GB will provide public health/hygiene training for 30 persons in cooperation with local health authorities and the State Epidemiological Center.

# **Relief and Recovery Assistance**



Recent assistance from Operation Mercy Tajikistan to the Kulob stadium camps included the following:

- 400 bags of laundry detergent
- 200 containers of dish washing liquid
- 400 sets of male and female underwear
- 200 sets of slippers
- 200 plastic bags.

A total of 76 sixteen person tents and family kits have been delivered by the US Government to Kulob on 17 May 2010. Some of these tents will be provided to the camp sites in Kulob and other are expected to be allocated to address needs in rural areas.
